I look forward to welcoming you to The Deanes.






SUBJECTS STUDIED AT KEY STAGE 4


We develop future citizens who have a holistic set of skills and values that prepare them for life in a diverse, ever changing, modern world.



To further ease this transition, we have a dedicated email address for Year 7 parents. Regular contact is maintained throughout the year via our online systems and Parents' Evenings.


